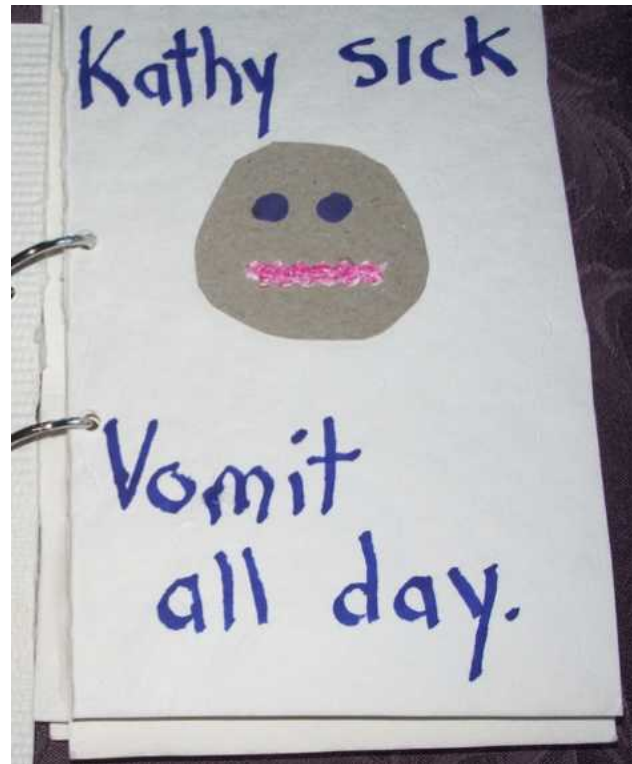


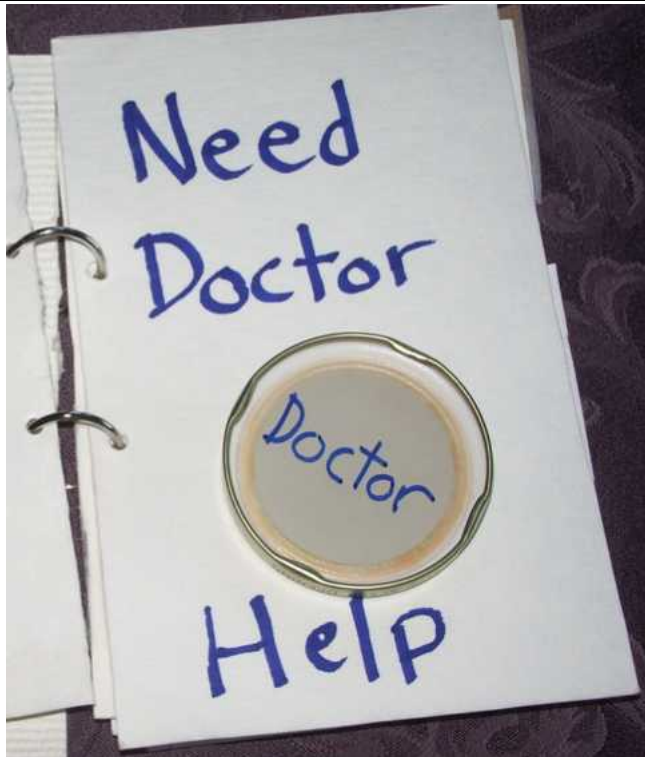
A Trip to the Hospital

This book was created to help a student anticipate a trip to the doctor. Name recognition is one of her IEP goals, therefore, the student's name is prominent on most pages. The feeling cues in the book are removable (Velcro attachment), doctor cue when placed on chest feels like a stethoscope, tape and IV tubing are real, the last page has a finished slot for her sick cue to go into. Velcroed on the back is a removable reading guide intended to help the student's eyes focus on a word. All words in these books have a sign language equivalent. In the "Day" book the feeling cue and glove are both removable to encourage conversation.

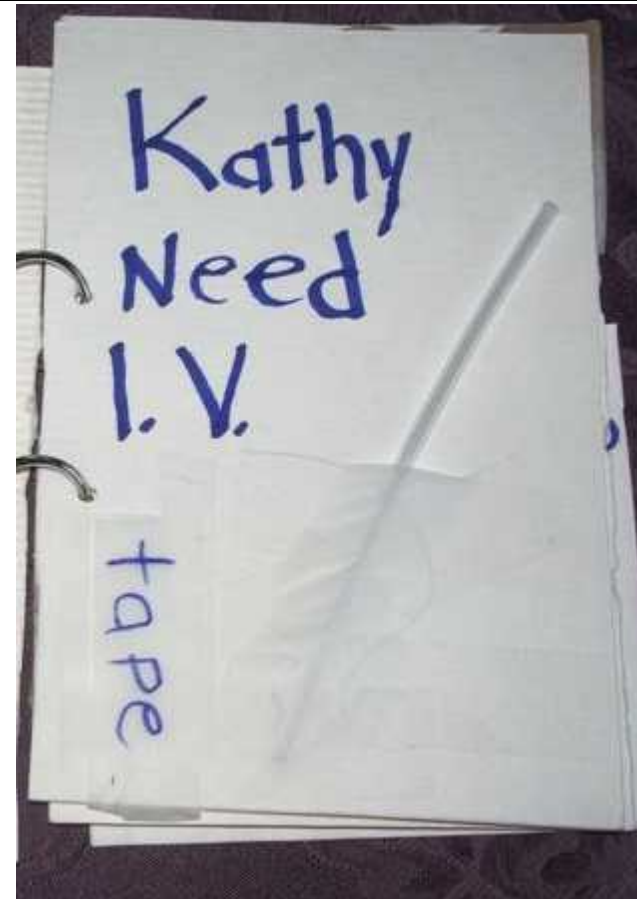


The cue at the top of the cover page is a hospital ID band marked with her name.

Page 1 - smells like the hospital,(hand sterilizer and hospital floor cleaner)



The lid feels like a stethoscope when removed and placed on the skin.



Additional directions were provided to flick the inside of the arm as a physical cue for the IV.



On the day Kathy went to the hospital, she reviewed the book.



Additional information was given.

The sick symbol goes into the finished pouch and the happy symbol goes into the book.
